Wine cellar Italy at 31 October 2022

The Report is drawn up by the ICQRF on data recorded in the wine computerized registers, which at 31 October 2022 are 21,012. ICQRF estimates that the database contains at least 95% of wine and must held in Italy.

Wines: 46.6 million hectoliters. Compared to the past 30 September 2022, stocks are 18.8% higher (+7,360,067 hectoliters). The stocks are 9.7% higher compared to 31 October 2021 (+4,121,388 hectoliters).

1.Summary

On 31 October 2022, in Italian oenological premises, there are 46.6 million hectolitres of wine, 17.7 million hectolitres of musts and 15.1 million hectolitres of new wine still in fermentation. Compared to the stocks recorded on 31 October 2021, as reported in table 7, the stocks are higher for wines (+9,7%) and for new wine still in fermentation (+3.6%), but lower for musts (-3,1%). As shown in table 8, compared to the stocks recorded on 30 September 2022, stocks started increasing for wine (+18.8%), and kept increasing for musts (+54.2%) and for new wine still in fermentation (+193.3%).

The 59.7% of wine in Italy is physically stocked in the northern regions, mainly in Veneto region.

The 52.1% of the wine in stock is PDO, 26.3% of wine is PGI, while the varietal wines stocks represent just 1.4% of the total. The remaining 20.2% consists of other wines.

The GIs stocks are highly concentrated; in fact, the first 20 of 526 registered names represent more than half of the total GI stocks (59.3%).





Figure 1. Trend of the wine stocks by category: 1st February 2018 – 31 October 2022




Data at 31 August of each year are influenced by the partial closure of the registrations related to the previous campaigns.

Where is physically stocked the wine in Italy?

The 59.7% of wine in Italy is stocked in the northern regions. In Veneto, there is the 24.2% of the national wine, thanks to the significant effect of stocks in the provinces of Treviso (11.3%) and Verona (7.9%).

Figure 2. Wine stocks by Region and Geographical Area





Figure 3. Wine stocks by Province



Which wines in the wine cellar Italy?

The 52.1% of the wine in stock is PDO, with a prevalence of red (48.7%). 26.3% of wine is PGI, with a prevalence of red (59.6%), while the varietal wines stocks represent just 1.4% of the total. The remaining 20.2% consists of other wines.

Despite the large number of GIs registered (526), the GIs stocks are highly concentrated; in fact, the first 20 names represent more than half of the total GI stocks (59.3%).

Figure 4. PDO/PGI wines stocks by Region





Figure 5. Other wines stocks by Region



3. MUSTS stocked in Italy as of 31 October 2022

The musts are mainly stocked in the southern (45%) and northern (39%) regions of Italy. In the top 2 Regions are stocked the 57.9% of the musts: Puglia (36.5%) and Emilia-Romagna (21.4%).





Figure 6. Musts stocks by Region

The new wines still in fermentation are 15.1 million hectolitres, stocked as follow: 54.7% in the North, 20.6% in the South, 13.2% in the Central Regions, and the remaining 11.5% in the Islands.
