## **Global Food Security – before COVID-19**

The world is not on track to achieve Zero Hunger.






- The world was not on track to achieve SDG2 already before the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- SDG Indicator 2.1.1: Prevalence of Undernourishment (PoU) is **not on track.**
- SDG Indicator 2.1.2: Prevalence of moderate or severe food insecurity in the population, based on the Food Insecurity Experience Scale (FIES) is **not on track.**





#### **Global Food Security – after COVID-19**


The outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic is expected to have a significant effect on global food security.








#### **COVID-19 Impact on Nutritional Outcomes**



#### **Childhood stunting**

- Additional 2.6 million chronically malnourished children by 2022
- Reverse the decreasing curve for the first time in 3 decades

#### **Childhood Wasting**

- 6.7 million additional children under 5 could suffer from wasting
- 10,000 additional child deaths per month

#### **Childhood Obesity**

- Childhood obesity worsen due to negative impact on diet and physical activity
- Obesity is associated with higher lethality



- Once containment becomes necessary to flatten epidemic curve, it causes a dee recession




#### **WORLD ECONOMIC OUTLOOK APRIL 2021**

### **Food Coalition Contribution to the G20 Ministerial Meetings (2021)**


The Food Coalition will focus on the following priority areas of work for substantial contribution to the G20 Ministerial Meetings during 2021:

- 3) Reduction of Food Loss and Waste
- 4) Food Systems Transformation

## **Step 1: Expression of Interest**

- 1) Preparatory Phase-Opportunity to express interest:
  - 1) Four thematic areas of work
  - 2) Countries selecting the area of interest and it's subcategory to receive or provide support
  - 3) Assessment of response and match-making by FAO





## Step 2: Call for Proposals launched on G20 Foreign Ministers Meeting (29 June 2021)

Main Requirements for the submission of the Proposals by the Members:

- 1. Multilateral: joint proposal presented by **minimum of TWO countries**
- 2. Multi-stakeholder: the participant country to <u>ensure inclusion</u> of one of the <u>following Non State Actors by each country</u>; academia, private sector, civil society, etc.
- 3. Country-Owned: reflect the **need** and demand on the ground
- 4. Thematic Focused: focus on the **four selected priority areas** of work






## **Step 3: Formulation of Proposals (29 June to 19 September)**

- 1) Countries to submit joint proposals (minimum two countries)
- 2) Selected a theme from the four categories
- 3) Each country to present an additional stakeholder (PS, Academia, etc.)
- 4) Work with FAO's Covid-19 & Tech teams to formulate the proposal
- 5) Submit by 19 September 2021 (G20 Agriculture Ministers Meeting)
