UN Assembly September 2015 adopted "Transforming our world: the 2030 agenda for sustainable development".

- Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)
- 17 goals, 169 targets.
- Blueprint to achieve a better and more sustainable future for all.
- SDGs address the global challenges we face (poverty, inequality, climate, environmental degradation, prosperity, and peace and justice).
- SDGs interconnect target for total accomplishment 2030.

- Productivity: Best practice agriculture / Minimizing waste / Maximizing efficiencies / Farmer profitability
